Ron Hoover opened at 7:00 with a brief introduction on the many wonderful and exciting activities at Due West that Rob is currently involved with. Some of those activities include Disciple Bible Study, Men's Group, Missions, Habitat House, and Backpack Lunches, and many years as a Sunday School Teacher. Ron followed with a devotional titled: **Opportunities to Voice our Faith**

Shared a story about having lunch with an Olympic athlete, Jim Ryun, who was from his hometown, but they had never met. This athlete was the first high school student to break the 4-minute mile. As a junior he ran the mile in 3:59.0. As a senior, he set the US record. Two years later he broke the world record twice. In the 1968 Summer Olympics he won the silver medal in the 1500 meter. In the 1972 Olympics, he fell on the track and did not qualify. Believing he was fouled; the US team filed a protest. One man made the decision. He said that while the video showed that Jim had been fouled, they could not let him run again. It would set a dangerous precedent for the Olympics. He returned home angry, feeling that he had been cheated. He and his wife accepted Christ 2 months before the Olympics. During his time of study, he heard the Lord say, Jim you have a decision to make. You can wallow in self-pity for the rest of your life or forgive the man and move on. This is what he did. There was no lightning, no thunder, no earthquake, but in his heart, he knew that he had forgiven the man. At the luncheon on August 8, 1987, he shared his story of how accepting Christ provided the tools needed to voice his faith as opposed to sharing his accomplishments as an athlete.

- Comparing totals for 2019, 2022, and 2023, [Jan-Sept]: overall numbers are increasing back to pre-Covid levels, but the distribution is vastly different.
- Even though S.S. numbers are about 50% less, small groups have increased 200% since 2019.
- We have at least 4 new small groups that are beginning this fall, so the outreach is increasing, even with short-term small groups being a part of the mixture.....or maybe the short-term groups are what are increasing participation?

- Women's fall kick off was a good turnout. We ended up with 21 women, several walk-ins, and several new faces. Taylor did a great job teaching us how to make clay pumpkins!
- Beauty of Fellowship starts back up from summer break Tuesday night. We are meeting at my house for a fire, devotion, information on what our next 8 months will look like and share mission projects and close with caramel apples and fellowship.
