Ron Moore delivered the devotional. Expressing his gratitude toward Pastor David for his pastoral care and new series on Holy Habits. We are very grateful and blessed that God put both David and Sam at Due West!

Devotional: *Things Are Not Always What They Seem*. Sometimes we prejudge individuals and situations based on initial impression. Provided several examples.

- Young David Allen who passed out in church. Not because it was so hot that day. He had found Jesus.
- Initial impression when Christine first came onboard as our Musical Director. The purple hair raised some eyebrows. She has kept the tradition of developing an outstanding music ministry!
- Tom Davisisms: Anyone who enters the church is very important. How would Jesus think and respond.

Ron shared a photo of Jason Bradley DeFord. Emerging Country Music artist who was recently nominated for CMA Award for Best New Artist. Looks and appearance are deceiving. Before making it as an artist, Jason spent time in prison for armed robbery. Also, a former drug dealer. He testified before congress to support a bill called FEND to help combat the country's fentanyl crisis. - 2023-2024 (Jan): \$ 188,550 in giving and \$143,655 in expenses.
- 2023-2024 (YTD): \$1,131,989 in giving and \$1,130,948 in expenses.
- Disaffiliation funds remaining: \$52,000 The committee recommends we leave funds in place until a decision is made regarding a potential new affiliation.
- \$52,000 is in a restricted account. There was a motion to leave these funds as is. There was a first and second motion to leave. The vote was unanimously approved by show of hands.

- Staff Parish celebrated Lora for her service to DWMC and also Celebrated with Sam on his Ordination with the Global MC.
- Big Thanks to Avery Flower who organized all of these celebrations and also thanks to all on our committee who helped to put on both of these worthy celebrations.

<u>Stewardship – Monty Allen</u>

- As of last Thursday, we had 134 pledges for a total of \$1,103,080 (average of \$8,232 each).
- We have 487 individual members (actually a few more, but we don't yet have their contact information); this member total is made up of around 265 families (estimate from Nan Relf, as Church Center doesn't capture "family" data).
- From those 265 families, we have 109 pledges for a total of \$927,580.
- So, that means we have 25 pledges from non-members for \$175,500.
- All this means that around 59% of all member families have <u>not</u> made a pledge.
- Working on developing a plan / program to encourage every family to make a pledge to our church, perhaps tying it to our Membership Covenant, to which each new member has committed, which includes "Offering to the church a part of the financial blessings I have received from God."
